



Ibusuki a retro, tropical town

Ibusuki city is located at the southernmost tip of the Satsuma Peninsula.

With an annual average temperature of 18 °C, due in part to warm ocean currents, Ibusuki was once dubbed the "Hawaii of the Orient" during the honeymoon boom of the 1960s. The landscape is overflowing with majestic natural attractions including Lake Ikeda, Mt. Kaimon, and worldrenowned natural Sand Steam Bath, which are a rarity worldwide. The warm climate also provides abundant gourmet delights such as okra, broad beans, and katsuobushi (dried bonito flakes). Ibusuki is a warm and happy place, with a tropical and nostalgic atmosphere. Enjoy Ibusuki, where both the people and climate are warm.

Tamatebako Open-Air Hot Springs

No. 1 in numerous scenic hot spring rankings!

One of Japan's finest infinity hot springs that appears to merge with the East China Sea before your eyes. Enjoy a Japanese-style open-air bath with a sweeping view of Mt. Kaimon, or a Western-style open-air bath with a view of the unusually-shaped Mt. Takeyama. The baths are swapped daily between male-only and female-only access.

Ibusuki is one of the top three producers of dried bonito in Japan. Most notably, it is the largest producer of high-quality Hongare Honbushi dried bonito, which takes about six months to produce!

Rvugu Shrine

Did Urashima Taro set out from here on his journey to the Dragon Palace?

Set against the blues of the sky and sea, the vermillion-lacquered Shinto gate and shrine seem to transport you to the Dragon Palace. This is one of the birthplaces of the tale of Urashima Taro. It is also the location where he and Princess Toyotama (Oto-hime) met, so this popular shrine is a renowned spot for relationships. There is a unique form of prayer here-writing your name and wish on a shell.

Nagasakibana

A cape with stunning views of Yakushima in clear weather

Jutting out from the southernmost point of the Satsuma Peninsula, this cape offers breathtaking panoramic views of the sea and sandy beaches, as well as the stunning sight of Mt. Kaimon. Legend says that Urashima Taro departed from this spot for the Dragon Palace, and the Ryugu Shrine that deifies Oto-hime is nearby

Mt. Uomi

A sweeping view of Chiringashima Island and the city.

This mountain has an elevation of 215 m and resembles Hawaii's Diamond Head. It is a scenic spot with about 600 cherry blossom trees blooming in the spring and azaleas that bloom in early summer. You can drive all the way to the top of the mountain, and on clear days, Sakurajima and Cape Sata can be seen in the distance.

Mystical Shinto gates that overlook Ikeda Lake and Mt. Kaimon

A spiritual power spot with sweeping views of Ikeda Lake and Mt. Kaimon viewed through the Golden Torii. It's also home to a golden dragon that spouts water of happiness. Known as a place for reputed blessings for wealth, visitors can toss coins into baskets perched on one of the gates for financial luck or toss balls into a target to trigger a water spout.

Chiringashima Island

Take a sandy road that emerges in low tide to visit an uninhabited island

Chiringashima is a desert island about 800m from the main island. The sandy Chiriri this mystical spot. It is considered to be auspicious island for matchmaking because it connected to land. The island has a walking path and an observation platform with the Chirin's Bell that is said to bring happiness when rung.

Fudosan Seiryu Temple

A sprawling Japanese garden sprawled over a site of about 30K tsubo (100K square meters approx.)

Located in the mountains at an elevation of 300 m, this temple boasts an original complex of temple buildings, which is rare in Kyushu. Created by monks, the stunning Japanese garden is decorated with boulders, moss, and stone lanterns. Visitors can enjoy the seasonal beauty of flowers like azaleas, weeping cherry trees, and autumn leaves. Food offerings include an American-style cafe

A paradise filled with flowers from around the world

A flower-themed park located near Nagasakibana. Flower Park Kagoshima embraces the warm climate and topography and is surrounded by natural pine forests. 





Yamagawazuke

Yamagawazuke is a local specialty of Ibusuki, made by hanging daikon radish on the Satsuma Peninsula in the cold air to dry, and then pickling it in earthenware jugs. The taste varies by shop due to the differences in the pickling vinegar and recipes, so we recommend finding your favorite.


Sweet Potato Shochu Highball Ibusuki Shuwacchi

Made by the local confections shop Torigoeya, this baked manju (bun) is filled with a moist sweet-potato filling and dusted with cinnamon. This famous Ibusuki treat was presented as an offering to the Showa Emperor and also won the Prime Minister's Award in 1959.



Rapeseed Flower Dressing

This dressing uses the boiled blossoms and soft stems of young rapeseed flowers grown in Ibusuki Made with healthy rapeseed oil, this refreshing and delicious lets you taste the flavor of spring in İbusuki.



SUBSOUP Chabushi

Yutaka-midori tea leaves grown in Ei and high-quality dried bonito from Yamagawa are used in this instant miso soup. Just add hot water to taste the deep flavor and richness of dried bonito. Dried bonito flakes are packaged separately, so you can sprinkle them on top at the end.
